Greetings Kids' Plates Grantees,

Well... this is it for this round of funding. I have thoroughly enjoyed working with each of you and I hope to have the opportunity to do so again.

Some Reminders:

For all training, equipment, and mini-grant grantees. Your Kids' Plates funded programs ended Friday, May 16, 2003. All eligible expenditures must have been completed by that date in order to be reimbursed. Please be sure to hang on to all of your program and fiscal documents in case you are asked for them later on.

In order to close out this round of funding, I need the following from each KP funded program by June 16, 2003 :

- 1) The final program report (Please include any copies of clippings, videos, pictures and/or educational materials developed with KP funds);
- 2) The final program invoice (if needed);
- 3) The final fiscal report (signed and dated); and
- 4) The "Grantee's Release Form" (Exhibit F in your contract).

Keep in mind that the last 25% of your program funds are held until all of the required documents are received and approved. Please call me if you have any questions about any of these requirements.

For All Program Development Grantees (\$65,000 grants): Your program's fiscal cycle ends on June 30, 2003. All of the required documents (outlined above), are due by July 30, 2003.

The Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN) grant program will have four funding initiatives, which will be rolled out over the next few months. First among these initiatives are the crime analyst and the media and outreach programs:

- 1) Research Partner/Crime Analyst Grant Funding. Award approximately \$150,000 for three-year grants to one recipient located in each of the 93 federal judicial districts.
- 2) Media Outreach and Community Engagement. Award approximately \$170,000 for two-year grants to one recipient located in each of the 93 federal judicial districts.
